PERFORMANCE GAP/NEED:

Pelvic pain/endometriosis can affect up to 10% of the population, yet time of presentation to diagnosis averages seven years.

DESIRED OUTCOMES: At the end of the presentation, attendees will be able to:

- Identify symptoms, ultrasound findings and clinical presentations suggestive of endometriosis.
- Employ a multidisciplinary and multimodal treatment strategy in women with pelvic pain/endometriosis.
- Utilize new medications for treatment of endometriosis.
- Recognize both short and long-term consequences of endometriosis/pelvic pain.
- Recognize the disparity in availability of diagnosis and treatment options in under- and un-insured population.

LEARNERS: OB/GYN, surgeons, general/family practitioners, maternal/child nurses, social workers.

DESIRABLE PHYSICIAN ATTRIBUTE: provide patient-centered care, employ evidence-based practice

IMPLICIT BIAS: physicians may have a bias toward women with chronic pain of unknown origin
